GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES

Supervises and/or performs the analysis, design, development, implementation, maintenance, operation, and enhancement of a comprehensive computer data warehouse encompassing a variety of databases from the school districts in Nassau County; performs related duties as required.

COMPLEXITY OF DUTIES

Under general supervision, the duties are complex and require a high level of technical skill and independent judgment in analyzing multiple databases for inclusion into a data warehouse. May supervise subordinate technical personnel engaged in data warehousing functions.

TYPICAL DUTIES

- * 1. Supervises and/or participates in the analysis of multiple, and often disparate, databases to determine feasibility of inclusion into a data warehouse and/or data mart.
- * 2. Supervises and/or participates in the design of the data warehouse/mart based on input from the users as to the scope of the warehouse/mart and what different types of data should go into it.
- * 3. Supervises and/or participates in the organization of data elements into a conceptual data model.
- * 4. Supervises and/or participates in using the conceptual data model as a blueprint to develop a physical database design.
- * 5. Supervises and/or participates in writing extraction programs to collect data from the various databases and files.
 - 6. Supervises and/or participates in developing routines to update the data warehouse/mart data regularly from the participating school districts' databases.
- * 7. Supervises and/or participates in developing and maintaining adequate security measures to prevent unauthorized changes to the data warehouse/mart contents.

*ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

- 1. Thorough knowledge of the principles, practices, and techniques used in systems analysis and design.
- 2. Thorough knowledge of the differing characteristics of hierarchical and relational databases.
- 3. Thorough knowledge of the various aspects of data warehouse/mart administration, including defining data dictionaries, setting security levels, and monitoring the efficiency of system performance.

- 4. Considerable knowledge of the principles, practices, and techniques used in an online data processing system with remote data retrieval.
- 5. Ability to design, develop, and implement a data warehouse/mart system to provide maximum availability to users.
- 6. Ability to express oneself effectively, both orally and in writing.
- 7. Ability to supervise technical subordinates engaged in the various aspects of establishing and maintaining a data warehouse/mart system.
- 8. Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with associates, end users, and subordinates.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Training and Experience

Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a major in the computer field

and

Four years of satisfactory experience performing applications programming, system programming, computer systems development, data communications, and/or data base administration, including one (1) year as a project leader responsible for data administration, data base management system, operating system, capacity planning, and/or on-line applications programming.

- **NOTE:** 1. A Master's degree from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a major in the computer field may be substituted for one year of experience as described above, provided the baccalaureate major is in the computer field; however, there is no substitution for the one year as a project leader.
 - 2. Experience, as outlined above, in excess of the four-year requirement, may be substituted for college education on a year-for-year basis (thirty college credits equal one year).
 - 3. Completion of a program of instruction (minimum of 300 hours) in the computer field at a commercial school registered by the New York State Department of Education or an out-of-state branch of that school.
