GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES

Under general supervision, performs supervisory and skilled mechanical work connected with the maintenance and repair of automotive and other standard motor power equipment; performs related duties as required.

COMPLEXITY OF DUTIES

Work involves responsibility for diagnosing, assigning, and supervising the repair of automotive equipment. Assignments are received in the form of oral and written instructions or by complaints regarding the operation of specific vehicles. Work is checked through occasional inspections and by the quality of performance of repaired equipment.

TYPICAL DUTIES

- * 1. Supervises the operation of a shop engaged in performing major and minor repairs and modifications on automotive equipment and other standard motor powered equipment such as tractors, power mowers, air compressors, etc.
- * 2. Plans and assigns work to mechanics and helpers, and inspects work as required by volume of work and limitation of personnel.
- * 3. Instructs subordinates in standard methods of diagnosis and repair.
- * 4. Performs difficult repair and testing work and less skilled work as required by volume of work and limitation of personnel.
- * 5. Inspects work performed by outside contractors for conformance to specifications.
 - 6. Supervises the receipt, storage and issuance of parts, materials and supplies, and prepares requisitions for replacement of used items.
 - 7. Keeps shop records and reports on cost of labor and material.

- 1. Thorough knowledge of methods, terminology, practices, and safety requirements of motor repair.
