GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES

Develops and implements district-wide accident prevention, safety, and/or environmental health hazard prevention policies and practices in accordance with federal, state, and local guidelines; performs related duties as required.

COMPLEXITY OF DUTIES

Under general supervision, the duties require the use of independent judgment in planning, administering and coordinating an accident prevention, safety, and/or environmental health hazard prevention programs.

TYPICAL DUTIES

- 1. Plans and executes safety programs to insure continual awareness of all safety requirements.
- 2. Develops and administers policies and procedures to assure district-wide compliance with federal, state, and local regulations regarding environmental health hazards such as, asbestos management, chemical storage and oil tank monitoring policies.
- 3. Develops system for detecting and reporting unsafe practices and conditions.
- 4. Conducts accident and injury investigations to determine cause and takes necessary remedial action.
- 5. Administers school district right-to-know programs.
- 6. Arranges and conducts safety meetings, and recommends training sessions and educational programs.
- 7. Provides guidance on facility planning and recommends procurement of safety equipment and protective devices.
- 8. Conducts safety inspections of mechanical equipment, buildings, and grounds.
- 9. Maintains material safety data sheets.
- 10. Maintains records of all accidents, compiles statistics, and prepares necessary accident and safety reports and studies.

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

- 1. Considerable knowledge of the principles and practices of accident prevention, safety, and environmental health hazard prevention programs.
- 2. Considerable knowledge of the rules and regulations of safety.
- 3. Ability to make detailed investigations, analyze findings, and recommend corrective action.
- 4. Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with groups and individuals.
- 5. Ability to maintain accurate records.
- 6. Ability to express ideas clearly, both orally and in writing.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Training and Experience

Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university

and

Two years of responsible experience in a safety or environmental health hazard prevention program.

- **NOTE:** 1. Experience, as outlined above, in excess of the two-year requirement, may be substituted for education on a year-for-year basis up to a maximum of six years.
 - 2. In school districts designating environmental health hazard prevention duties to this position, attendance at EPA approved training courses may be required after appointment.

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
