GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES

Provides technical assistance in the development of educational programs and supervises and directs their production for television and cablevision; performs related duties as requried.

COMPLEXITY OF DUTIES

Under general supervision, the duties are highly creative and technical, involving the production, direction, editing and distribution of educational programs for television and cablevision in cooperation with school districts Countywide.

TYPICAL DUTIES

- 1. Produces and directs educational programs for television and cablevision.
- 2. Confers with teachers and television programmers to provide technical assistance on the display, layout, and presentation of materials for television.
- 3. Provides suggestions in the use of visual aids such as charts, graphs, and photography.
- 4. Supervises subordinate staff in the operation and maintenance of television and cablevision equipment.
- 5. Edits and cuts programs for available showing times, as required.
- 6. Plans for the distribution of programs.
