GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES

Researches, develops, and implements programs for the vocational rehabilitation of students with physical and/or mental handicaps; performs related duties as required.

COMPLEXITY OF DUTIES

Under general supervision, the duties require the use of independent judgment in the assessment and career counseling of handicapped students.

TYPICAL DUTIES

- *1. Interviews and evaluates handicapped students to identify areas requiring counseling.
- *2. Determines suitable occupational opportunities consistent with student's desires, aptitude, and physical/mental limitations.
- *3. Assists in the development of individual educational plans for handicapped students.
- *4. Provides counseling services designed to encourage and support the disabled student.
- *5. Confers and works with professional personnel, professional organizations, and parents of the handicapped student.
- *6. Prepares case records and reports.
- *7. May promote and develop job openings to place handicapped students in employment.
- 8. May arrange for appropriate medical, psychological, vocational, and other diagnostic evaluations.
- *9. Visits sites to counsel students at places of employment.

*ADA ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

- 1. Considerable knowledge of vocational rehabilitation casework principles and methods.
- 2. Considerable knowledge of individual and group behavior of the physically or mentally disabled.
- 3. Considerable knowledge of current educational, social, economic, and health programs in vocational rehabilitation.
- 4. Knowledge of the more common physical and mental illnesses and handicaps.
- 5. Knowledge of the skills, abilities, and physical demands of a wide variety of occupations.
- 6. Ability to express oneself effectively, both orally and in writing.
- 7. Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships with associates

and students.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Training and Experience

- 1. Master's Degree from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university in rehabilitation counseling, including a supervised internship; or
- 2. Bachelor's Degree from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university and

Two years of satisfactory experience in the field of vocational counseling or vocational rehabilitation.

NOTE: Graduate credit toward the Master's degree in Rehabilitation Counseling may be substituted for the above-described experience in increments of 12 credits equaling 6 months' experience, up to a maximum of 18 months' substitution.

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
