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GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES

Plans, develops, and maintains Web sites, and reviews the graphic and editorial content for consistency and conformance to the agency's communications goals; performs related duties as required.

COMPLEXITY OF DUTIES

Under general supervision, the duties are highly technical, requiring strong project management and interpersonal skills, as well as a good knowledge of software development, graphic design, and network configurations. The work requires the use of considerable independent judgment.

TYPICAL DUTIES

- * 1. Creates and designs Web sites and their content.
- * 2. Maintains and updates site content.
- * 3. Maintains graphic and editorial consistency.
- * 4. Designs and develops interfaces from Web pages to internal and external software systems and databases.
- * 5. Meets with prospective users to determine their Web site needs, and analyzes their requests.
- * 6. Provides cost estimates for Web site projects and activities.
- * 7. Participates in the research and analysis of new Internet/Intranet products and services, and makes recommendations based thereon.
- * 8. Monitors Web site performance, utilization, and effectiveness, and produces measurement statistics of the results.
 - 9. Analyzes throughput and bandwidth restriction issues, and applies load balancing and file optimization techniques to rectify known problems.
- * 10. Assures Web services are secure and always available, and that adequate fault tolerance is provided.
- * 11. Converts raw material into Hypertext Markup Language (HTML) format for display on the Web site.

***ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS**

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES

- 1. Considerable knowledge of Web server platforms, and Web management tools.
- 2. Considerable knowledge of systems analysis applicable to Web programming, Web servers, and security policies, including firewalls and proxy servers.
- 3. Considerable knowledge of HTML, Front Page, Javascript, C++, CGI scripts, and various Web and network analysis utilities.
- 4. Knowledge of Unix, NT, TCP/IP, domain names, and Intranets.
- 5. Ability to utilize Web development software.

- 6. Ability to develop Web site design strategies.
- 7. Ability to express oneself effectively, both orally and in writing.
- 8. Ability to diagnose, analyze, and resolve Web related problems.
- 9. Ability to create and edit various graphics, including GIF and JPG images.
- 10. Ability to establish and maintain working relationships with associates and client school district personnel.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Training and Experience

Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a major in a computer field

and

One year of satisfactory experience designing and maintaining Web sites.

- **NOTE:** 1. Experience, as outlined above, in excess of the one-year requirement, may be substituted for college education on a year-for-year basis (thirty credits equal one year).
 - 2. Proof of successful completion of a minimum of 300 hours of a program of instruction in a computer field at a commercial school registered by the New York State Department of Education, or an out-of-state branch of that school, may substitute for the major in a computer field

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
